



Impact in Alabama of the Affordable Care Act (ACA) (from OPE, U.S. Department of HHS)¹

Coverage Gains in Alabama thanks to the ACA (2010-2015)

- 215,000 people gained coverage, including
- 35,000 young people who gained coverage by staying on their parents' plan until 26 years of age
- An overall (even w/o Medicaid expansion) 4.5% decline in the uninsured.

Gains in Care, thanks to the ACA (2015)

- 531,567 Medicare Part B patients received free preventive services.

Consumer savings thanks to the ACA (Q1, 2016)

- For people with ACA Marketplace Plans
 - 152,206 people received subsidies averaging \$310/month
 - equals \$3720 in savings per person per year
- For people with Employer Group Plans
 - premium decrease from 7.1% annual growth rate in 2000-2010 to a 5.2% annual growth rate in 2010-2015
 - equals \$1500 annual savings per family in 2015
 - equals \$2200 annual savings per family in 2016

All these benefits lost to Alabama families if the ACA is repealed.
