



Impact in North Carolina of the Affordable Care Act (from OPE, U.S. Department of HHS)¹

Coverage Gains in North Carolina thanks to the ACA (2010-2015)

- 552,000 people gained coverage, including
- 70,000 young people who gained coverage by staying on their parents' plan until 26 years of age
- An overall (even w/o Medicaid expansion) 5.6% decline in the uninsured.

Gains in Care, thanks to the ACA (2015)

- 950,381 Medicare Part B patients received free preventive services.

Consumer savings thanks to the ACA (Q1, 2016)

- For people with ACA Marketplace Plans
 - 499,178 people received subsidies averaging \$401/month
 - equals \$4812 in savings per person per year
- For people with Employer Group Plans
 - premium decrease from 7.5% annual growth rate in 2000-2010 to a 4.7% annual growth rate in 2010-2015
 - equals \$2400 annual savings per family in 2015
 - equals \$3300 annual savings per family in 2016

All these benefits lost to North Carolina families if the ACA is repealed.
