

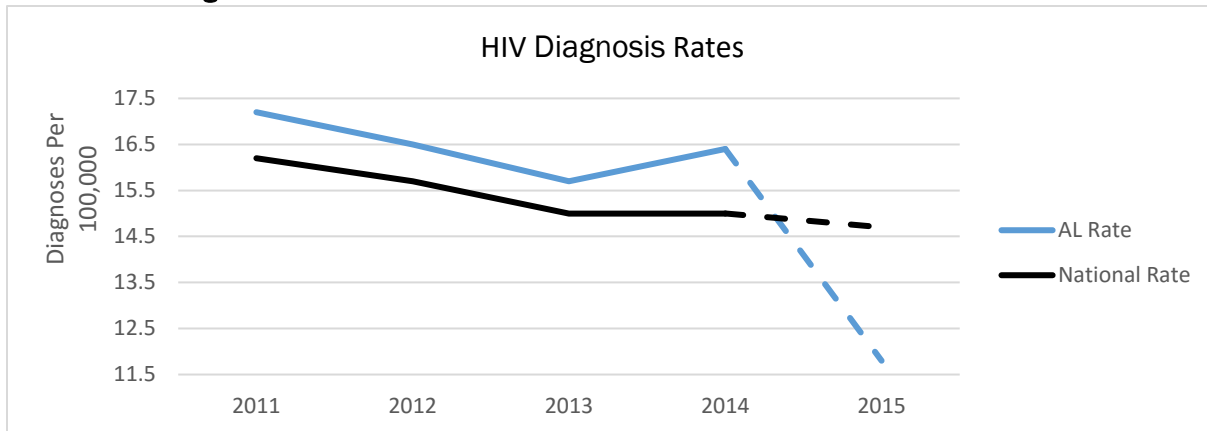


## HIV/AIDS in Alabama March 2017

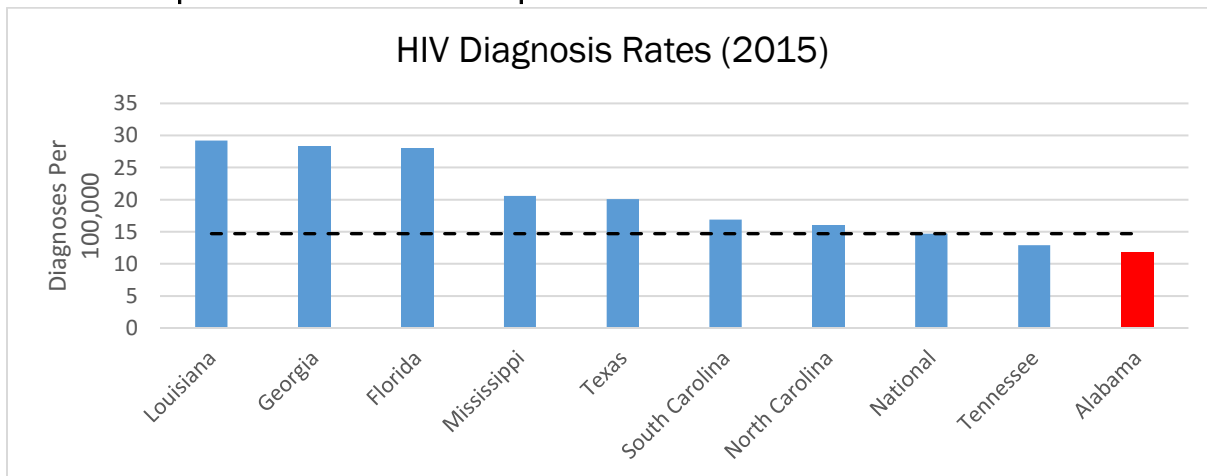
HIV in Alabama, by the most recent numbers.<sup>1</sup>

- **12,439**: the number of Alabamians living with diagnosed HIV/AIDS in 2014.
- **19th**: in the nation for HIV diagnosis rates in 2015. In 2015 alone, 481 were newly diagnosed.

Alabama's HIV diagnosis rate historically has been near the national HIV diagnosis rate, and preliminary data suggests that in 2015 Alabama will have a lower HIV diagnosis rate than the national HIV diagnosis rate.<sup>2</sup>
