

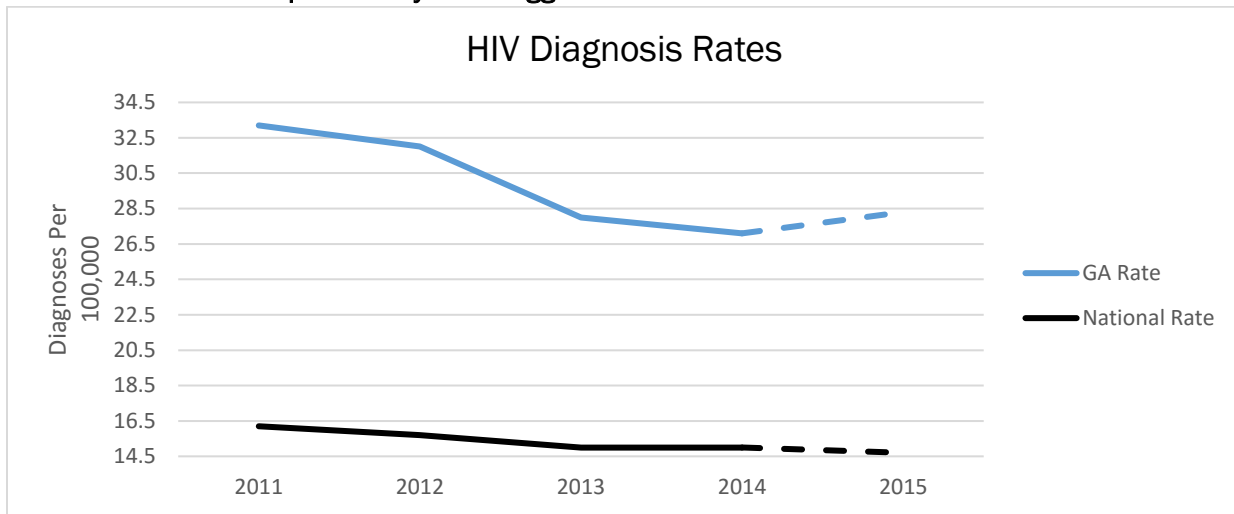


## HIV/AIDS in Georgia March 2017

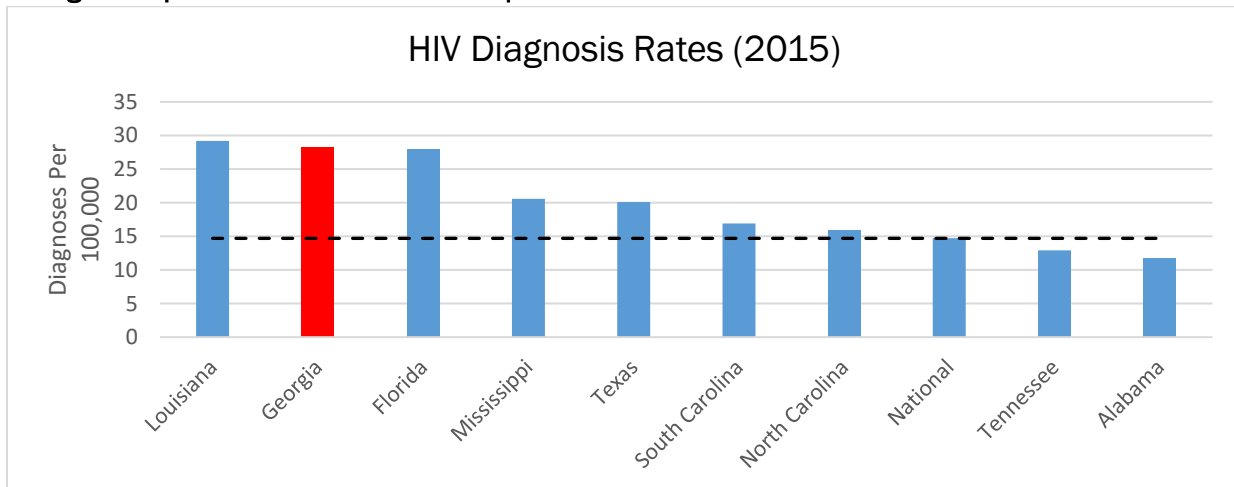
HIV in Georgia, by the most recent numbers.<sup>1</sup>

- **46,870**: the number of Georgians living with diagnosed HIV/AIDS in 2014.
- **3rd**: in the nation for HIV diagnosis rates in 2015. In 2015 alone, 2,381 were newly diagnosed.

While Georgia has made progress in reducing HIV diagnosis rates in recent years, Georgia still lags behind the nation and preliminary data suggests that trend will continue.<sup>2</sup>
