

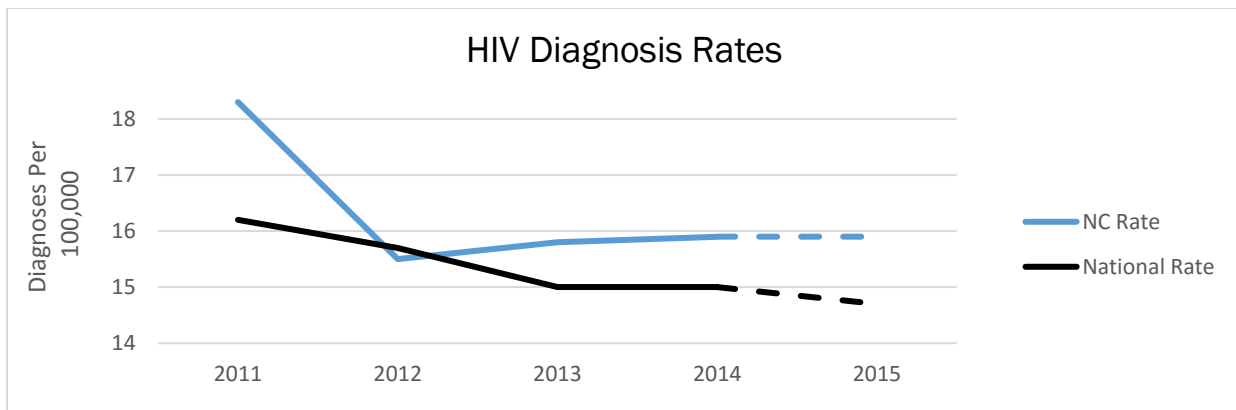


HIV/AIDS in North Carolina March 2017

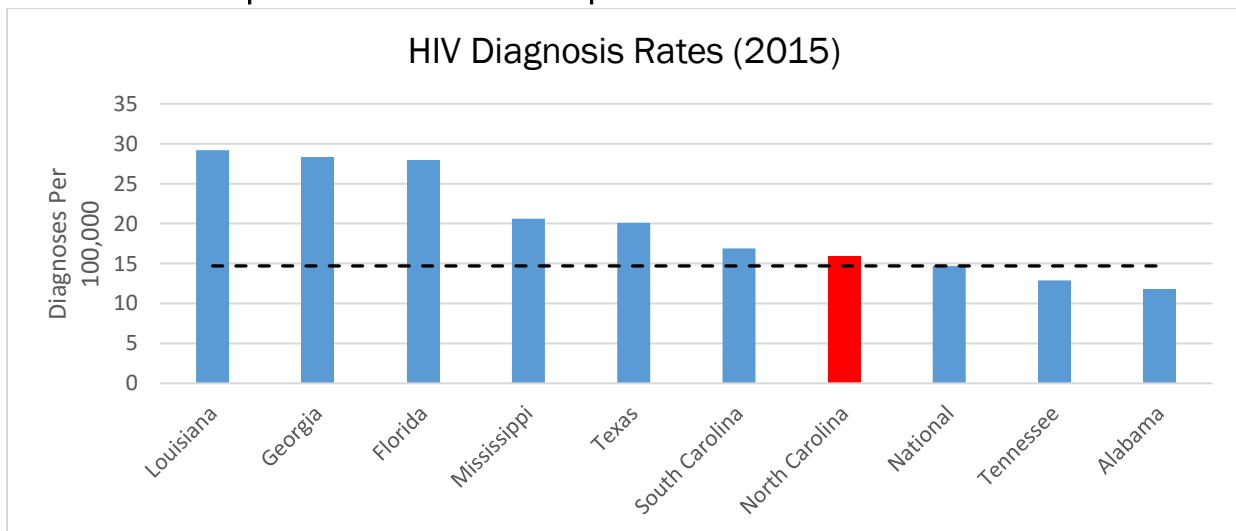
HIV in North Carolina, by the most recent numbers.¹

- **28,897**: the number of North Carolinians living with diagnosed HIV/AIDS in 2014.
- **8th**: in the nation for the number of HIV diagnoses in 2015. In 2015 alone, 1,335 were newly diagnosed.
- **11th**: in the nation for HIV diagnosis rates in 2015.

While North Carolina has made progress in reducing HIV diagnosis rates, North Carolina still lags behind the Nation and preliminary data suggests that trend will continue.²
